

SB2719 Domestic Violence Amendments (750 ILCS 60/214) Effective 1/1/09

Deletes everything after the enacting clause. Amends the Department of State Police Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois, the State Finance Act, the Criminal Code of 1961, the Unified Code of Corrections, the Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963, and the Illinois Domestic Violence Act, and provides that the Act may be referred to as the Cindy Bischof Law. Provides that the respondent shall undergo a risk assessment evaluation per protocols set by the Illinois Department of Human Services under such terms and conditions as the court may direct (rather than attend and complete partner abuse intervention programs). Creates the Domestic Violence Surveillance Fund in the State treasury. Provides that the offense of violation of an order of protection includes the respondent's failure to attend and complete partner abuse intervention programs. Provides that a person charged with a violation of an order of protection, as a condition of bail, may be ordered by the court to carry or wear a global positioning system device. Provides that a person convicted of violation of an order of protection, as a condition of parole, mandatory supervised release, or early release, shall be ordered to carry or wear a global positioning system device. Provides that a person sentenced to probation or conditional discharge for violation of an order of protection, as a condition of probation or conditional discharge, may be ordered to carry or wear a global positioning system device. Provides that in domestic violence cases, the court shall order the respondent to attend and complete partner abuse intervention programs. Adds to every penalty imposed upon a plea of guilty or finding of guilty resulting in a judgment of conviction of a violation of an order of protection an additional fine in an amount not less than \$200 which shall be deposited into the Domestic Violence Surveillance Fund. Amends the Probation and Probation Officers Act. Provides that the Division of Probation Services shall develop standards to implement the Domestic Violence Surveillance Program including (i) procurement of equipment and other services necessary to implement the program and (ii) development of uniform standards for the delivery of the program through county probation departments. Makes other changes.
